Graduate degrees contribute to lifelong learning among students who already have a Bachelors degree but want to continue their education, in a way that goes beyond classroom-based courses to do field-based research. A Master of arts or science degree in geography can provide a boost to your careers, as many employers increasingly value the sort of training provided by a graduate program. On our program website we list some of the current jobs of our alumni. This list reveals that our Masters graduates pursue incredibly diverse and rewarding careers that usually build on their graduate work. Some examples include work in refugee and immigrant service agencies around the world; government jobs in conservation, labour and other areas; NGO work including peace-building in Asia; environmental consultancies; an ecotourism manager in Asia; and even a city councillor in Montreal. Some of Masters alumni also go on to do PhD degrees, and our PhD graduate are successful in both academic and non-academic careers.

If you have a passion is for research and for going to the field, then a Masters degree program in Geography at York may be for you. We emphasize training through practice, which means working through a full research program including proposals, fieldwork, data analysis, and writing. And we have a very collegial program with lots of opportunity to spend time with your fellow students outside of the classroom in social events, colloquiums and so on. Because our first year undergraduate courses are growing as more and more students find that geography courses are an excellent way to learn about our rapidly changing world, we have Teaching Assistant positions to help fund graduate students, both Masters and PhDs.
